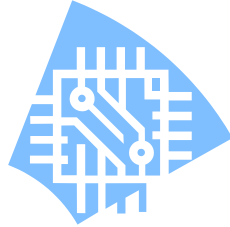


### Computer Software Engineer

Software engineers work normal hours, 40-hour workweeks, in a clean and comfortable office. With computer/office jobs, staring at a computer screen for hours on end can cause discomfort.

Most companies require at least a bachelor's degree and some broad computer knowledge and experience to hire. At a minimum the pay is around \$50,000 and goes up to around \$120,000 yearly. The amount of job opportunities is expected to rise exponentially as the world becomes more modernized.

### Chemist

Chemists develop new products or experiment with existing products to improve on them by combining different

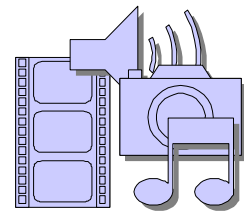


chemicals. They work a regular 40-hour workweek, usually in a laboratory. They often work with and around dangerous chemicals. A master's degree or ph. D is required for most chemist jobs

The pay is around \$35,000 to \$100,000 yearly. There is expected to be more competition as the world looks for alternate fuel sources.

### TV, Video, & Motion Picture Camera Operator/Editor

Camera operators do as their title suggests, they operate the cameras to shoot images or film to be used in movies, TV



shows, and such. They then edit the sound and visual affects using computers. They either travel to wear they are needed or work on a set.

Most companies require a Bachelor's degree and some field experience to hire. Work hours can vary but are usually around 5 hours a day, 40-hour weeks. The pay is around \$20,000 to \$85,000 yearly. There is a lot of completion for this job, as many people find the job enjoyable.
